'East Chiswick'

Local History

The first electric tramways in London started operating in April 1901 from LUET's headquarters on the High Road, and includes the routes from Shepherd's Bust to Young's Corner and from Hammersmith to Kew Bridge.

The car shed that held these trams became Stamford Brook bus garage in 1980. A small part of the top of the tram power house was converted into flats and recording studios in 1985.

Chiswick and West London Bowling and Lawn Tennis Club was founded in Airedale Avenue in 1920. This site is currently used by the Hogarth health Club, however bowling is no longer available!

General Opinion

East Chiswick offers a variety of residential property but predominantly offers four to five bedroom houses that are considered to be highly desirable due to the proximity of Chiswick High Road, local schools, transport connections combined with the convenience of having Hogarth Health Club within walking distance.

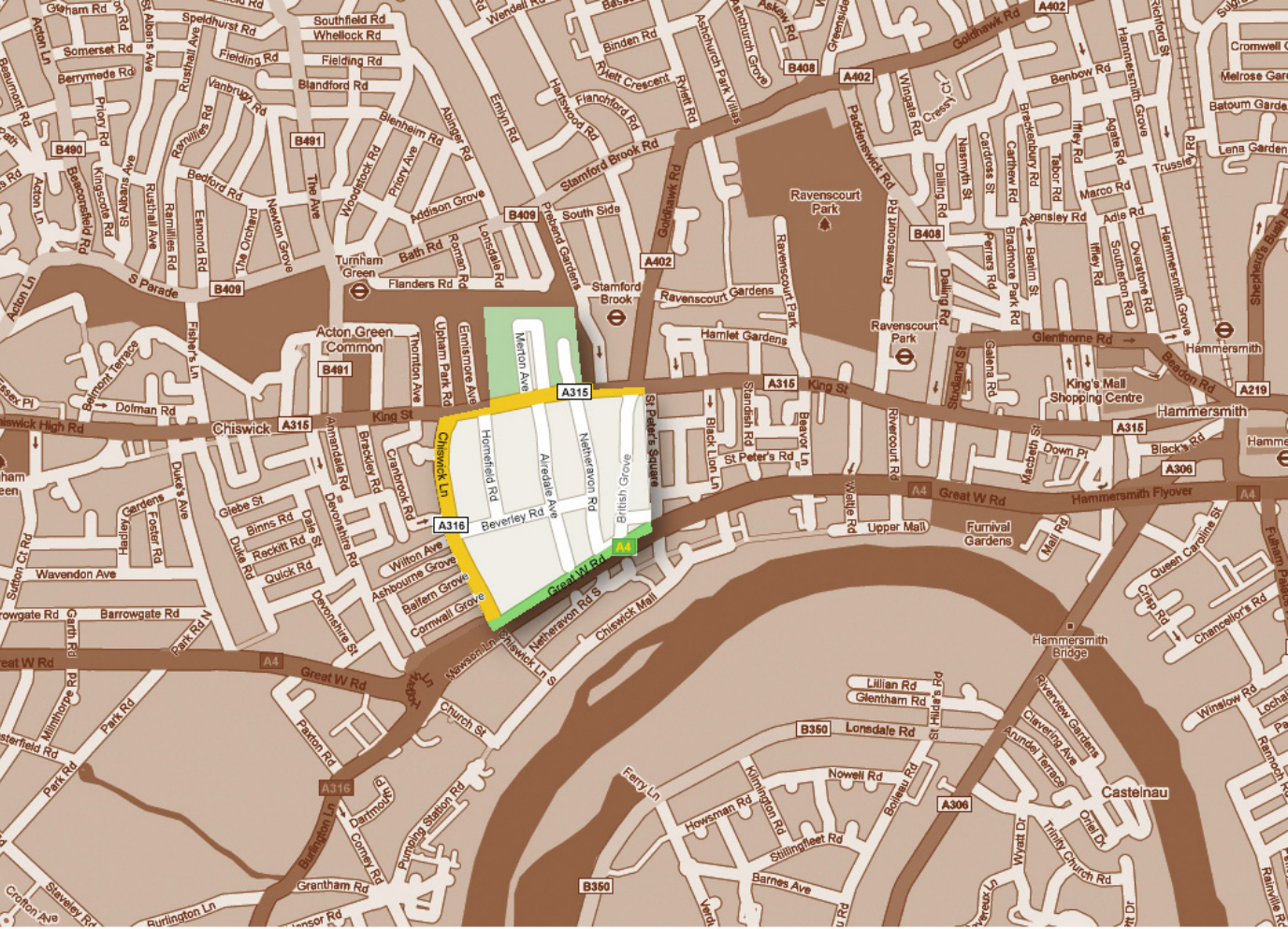

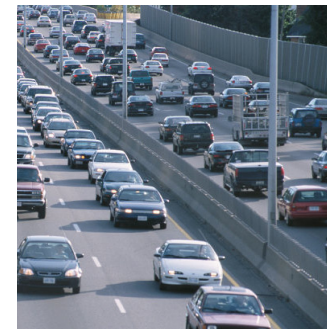
